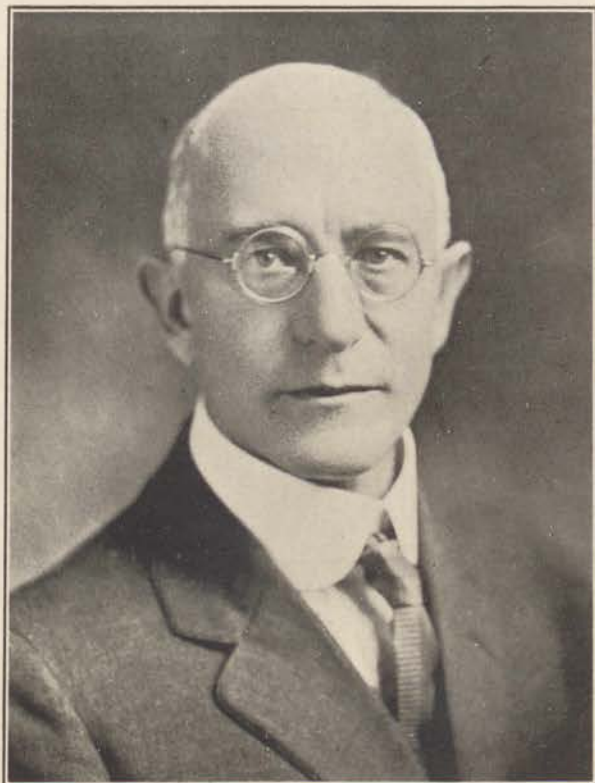

Principal



As I am "graduating" from B. H. S. with the class of 1926, the Editor in Chief has asked me to write something that might be considered as parting advice to the class and to the school.

In response to his request it has seemed to me that a sort of "Philosophy of Life" which has been of much comfort and pleasure to myself, might be of interest as well as profit to the boys and girls of Bangor High School.

In the first place, I have obtained much satisfaction and pleasure from hard work. Does that seem strange? Let's consider—Our life is made up of work and play. The most of us get food, shelter, clothing, and other necessities of life out of our employment. Is it not a distinct gain then to get pleasure out of our "job?" If we enjoy our work as well as our automobile, are we not getting more than the person who hates his work and enjoys the automobile only?

There is only one way to get satisfaction out of the job. Do a good job. Don't be satisfied with just holding it. Don't be satisfied with "just getting by." Do it as well as you know how and try to do it a little better than anyone else can do it. If you work in this spirit there will be no job too big for you. You will enjoy yourself in your work even though your place may be a very humble one.

Don't be selfish, don't work for yourself alone. Remember that your happiness depends in large measure upon the happiness of people around you.

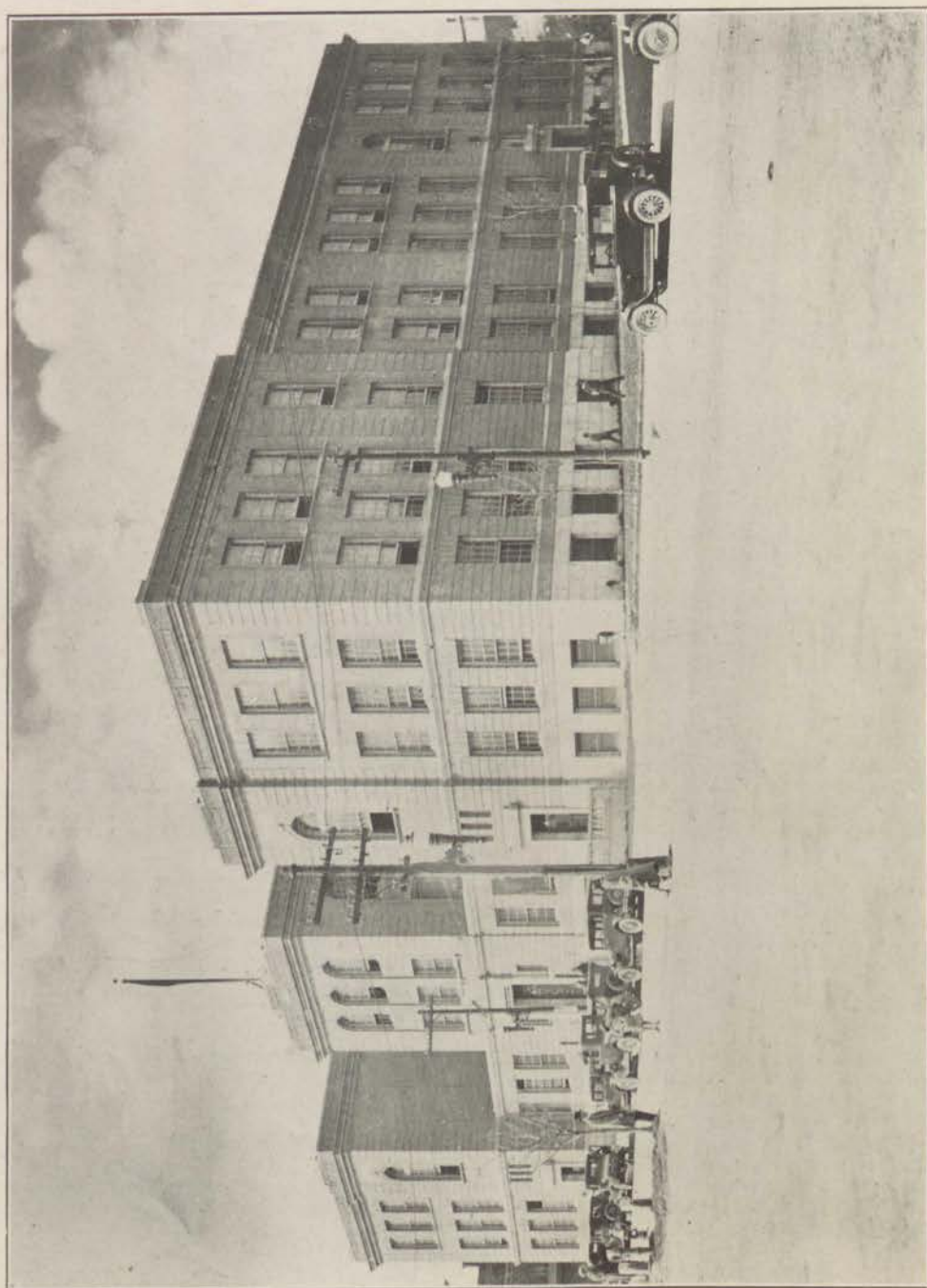
Try to find opportunities in your work which will enable you to be of service to others. Such opportunities may be found in any situation you hold. Look for them. It will pay, if not in money, at least in satisfaction.

Look for the best side of people—I suppose this impresses me especially because, in working with young people, I have found that if you expect well of them, they respond in the way expected. If you expect a boy to be bad, he will not disappoint you—if you expect good things, he will respond, if you trust him, he will not betray your trust. I have derived much pleasure from that philosophy. Although I am told at times that I am a poor judge of character, nevertheless, it is more pleasant to feel this way than to be always suspicious that someone has it "in for you." I do not recall a single person of my acquaintance with whom I could not sit down and talk without any embarrassment on my part. People do the best they know. If we wish them to do better, we must improve our means and methods of education.

Be square—In dealing with boys and girls this is especially important, but "grown ups" appreciate and respond to it just as well. You will make more friends and go further in your profession, your position, your job, whatever it may be if you keep this thought in mind. It is the "Golden Rule" abbreviated.

I wish all the good things of life to 1926 and to all the fine boys and girls with whom it has been my very great pleasure to work. May Bangor High never lose the position it holds, but rather progress to higher and higher positions in the years to come and may you all look back with pleasure upon your years spent within her walls. I have learned much from you and trust that you have learned as much from me.
