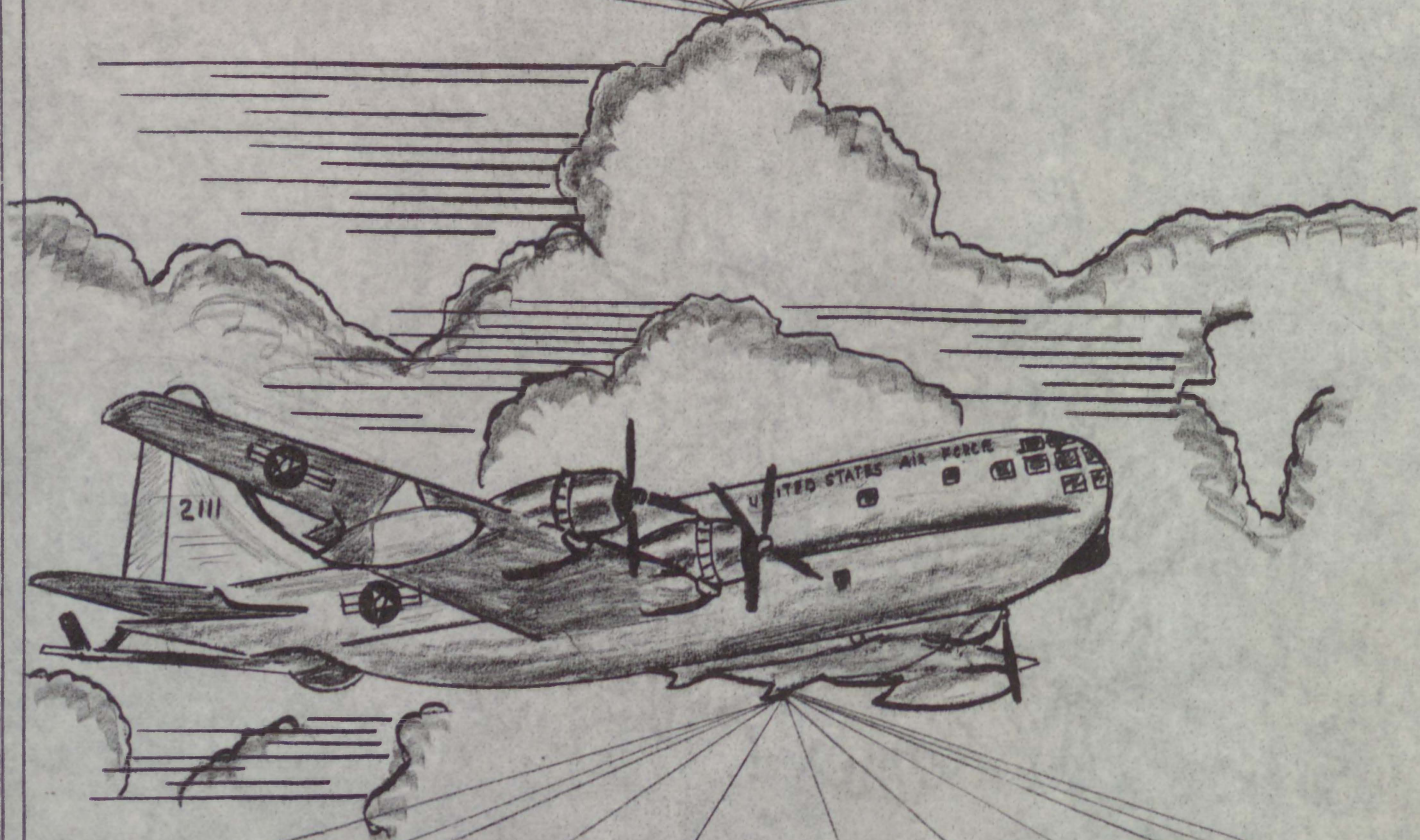

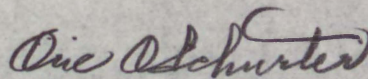

4060TH AIR REFUELING WING, MEDIUM

HISTORY

The 4060th Air Refueling Wing, Medium was organized at Dow Air Force Base on 8 March 1955, thus becoming one of the first Air Refueling Wings in the history of the United States Air Force. The wing is assigned the 506th Air Refueling Squadron, equipped with KB-29 type aircraft and is combat ready; the 71st Air Refueling Squadron, which is being equipped with KC-97G type aircraft the first of which arrived at Dow Air Force Base on 9 April 1955; the 4060th Armament and Electronic Maintenance Squadron; the 4060th Periodic Maintenance Squadron and the 4060th Field Maintenance Squadron.

The 4060th Air Base Group was organized at Dow Air Force Base on 8 March 1955 and assigned to the 4060th Air Refueling Wing. Personnel assigned to the 506th Air Base Group, which was inactivated 8 March 1955, were used in manning the Group.

The 4033rd USAF Hospital and the 33rd Crash Boat Rescue Flight at Southwest Harbor, Maine were assigned the 4060th Air Refueling Wing on 8 March 1955.

An intensive training program has been initiated to increase the combat potential of the wing.

The official mission of the 4060th Air Refueling Wing, Medium as established by 8th Air Force Regulation 23-18, dated 28 March 1955 is as follows:

- a. Organize and train a force capable of immediate and sustained air-to-air refueling operations in any part of the world, utilizing the latest technical knowledge and advanced procedures.
- b. Be prepared to perform those tasks assigned in current emergency plans and related operations orders.
- c. Participate in the Reserve training program to the maximum extent by training and administering assigned Reserve personnel and units.
- d. Be prepared to supervise the participation of assigned units in disaster relief and other domestic emergencies.
- e. Perform such missions and assignments as may be directed by higher headquarters.

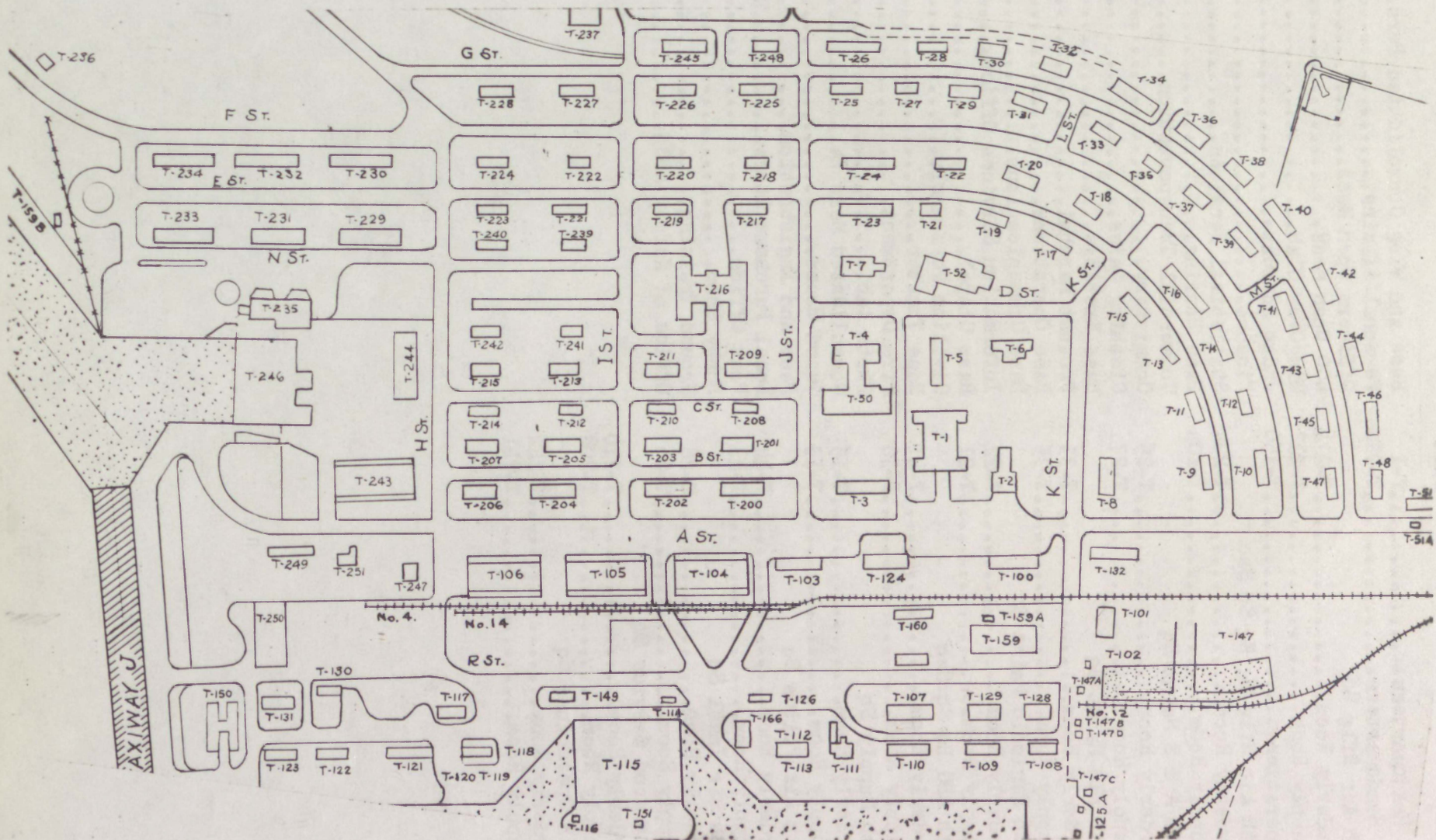

CITY OF BANGOR, MAINE

Bangor, with a population (1950 census) of 31, 558 is situated on the west bank of the Penobscot River, at the mouth of the Kenduskeag and head of navigation. It is 60 miles from the Atlantic Ocean and 75 miles north-east of Augusta, state capital. It was settled in 1769, incorporated as a town in 1791 and as a city in 1834, under the laws of Massachusetts. Bangor is the third largest city in Maine. A port of entry for ships and aircraft, it is also the county seat of Penobscot. It is the wholesale distributing center for northern and eastern Maine with major industries of wood pulp, paper, textile, canoe, shoe and moccasin, dental supply and machinery manufacturing and vegetable, sardine and blueberry canning. Considered the cultural and medical center of eastern Maine, Bangor supports a symphony orchestra, community concert association and a Public Library containing more than 261,000 volumes. Directly across the river is the city of Brewer, with a population of 6,817. Bangor and Brewer combined have more than 75 diversified industries.

Bangor is also considered the recreational center of Maine, a state containing 2500 lakes, hundreds of streams and a bracing summer climate. Fishing is excellent and deer, bear and other game are plentiful.

The altitude of Bangor is 192 feet above sea level. The average day temperature (1954-55 figures) in summer is 77.3 degrees, while the nights are cool with an average of 55.4 degrees. During winter months (December to March) night temperature are below freezing with a 14.9 degree average, while the average day temperature for winter is 32.7 degrees. Winters are normally clear and frosty with an average mean snowfall of 62.8 inches total, 55.4 inch total snowfall from December to April. Normal annual rainfall is 38.6 inches.

Nine miles from Bangor at Orono is the University of Maine offering a complete college curriculum and a variety of sports. This land-grant institution with an annual enrollment of more than 2,500 students has a high scholastic rating.

The Penobscot Valley Country Club, approximately six miles from Dow, on U.S. Highway #2, Orono Road, welcomes Dow personnel and offers an excellent 18-hole golf course. Lucerne Inn, Maine on the Bar Harbor Road, U.S. Highway #1, approximately ten miles from Bangor, offers a Country Club, swimming facilities and a 9-hole golf course. Tennis courts, bowling alleys and ball clubs are available in various sections of the City of Bangor. Horse back riding, varied types of fishing, hunting and winter sports in season are available. Bangor has four theaters, open daily at 1300 hours and Sunday at 1500 hours. There are two drive-in theaters, one located on Outer Hammond Street, U.S. Highway #2, and one on the Bar Harbor Road, U.S. Highway #1.

City of Bangor, Maine (Cont'd)

Northeast Airlines provide regular schedule air service, both north and south, and is situated on the Hammond Street side of Dow Air Force Base. The Bangor & Aroostook, Boston & Maine and Maine Central are the chief railroads serving Bangor, with the station located on Washington Street.

All Bangor churches particularly welcome servicemen and women and are eager to do their part in making service people feel at home in Bangor.

The YMCA is located at 127 Hammond Street; the YWCA is located at 174 Union Street; Bangor Hobby Center at 22 Franklin Street. The Bangor House, 174 Main Street and the Penobscot Hotel, 139 Exchange Street, offer good hotel accommodations.
