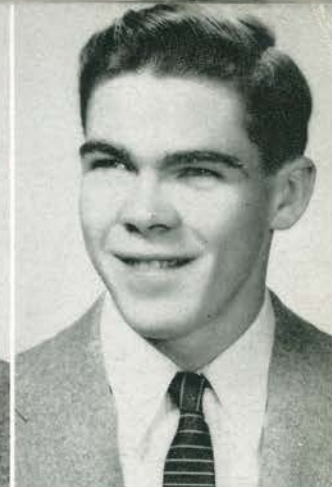

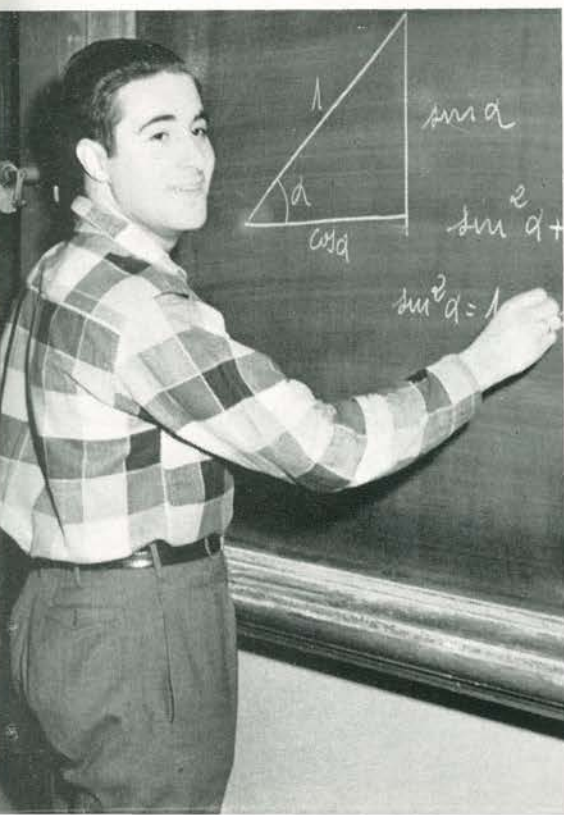
Meet B. H. S. Exchange Student Ramon Garces

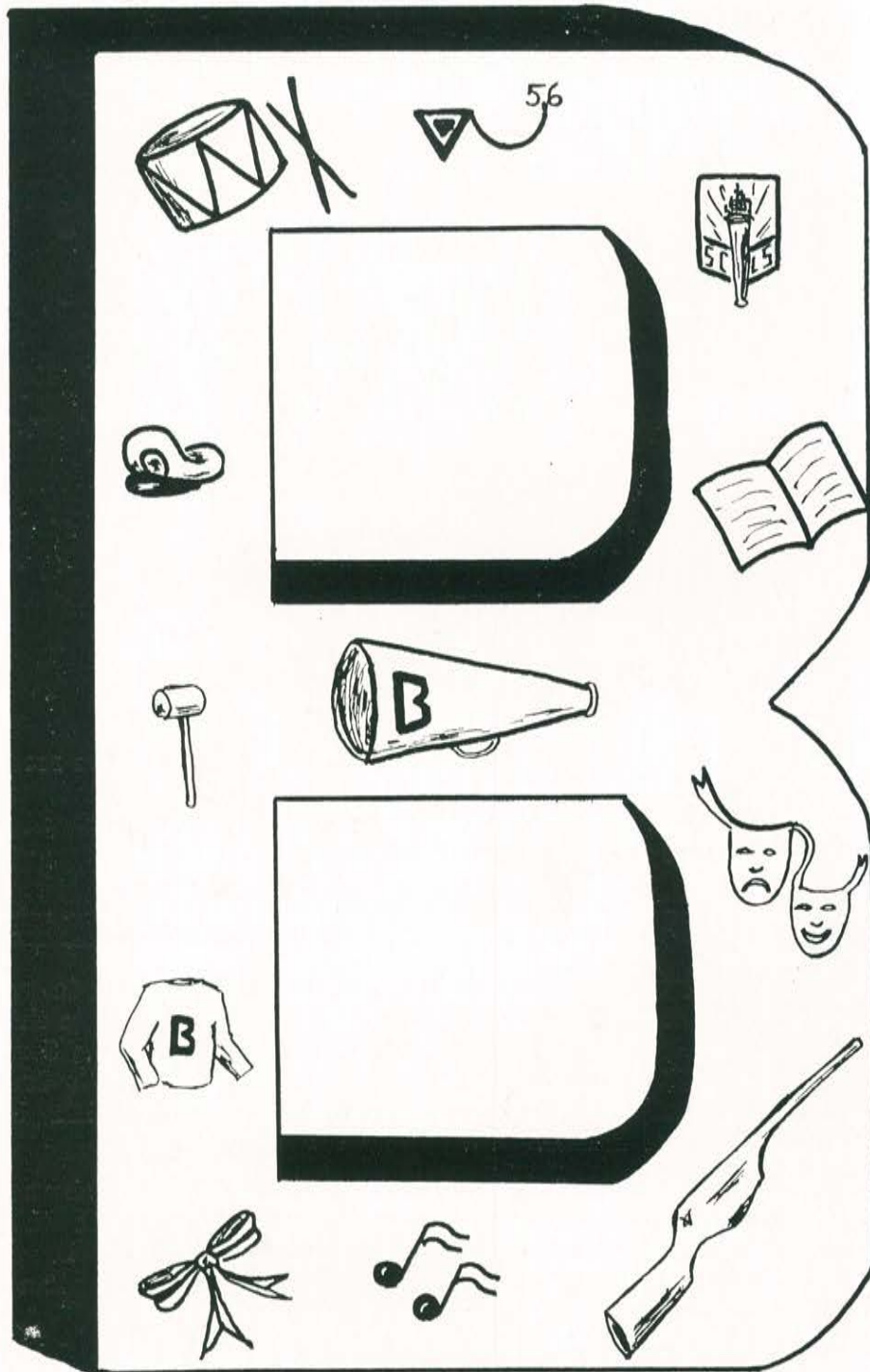
Bangor High School Scholars

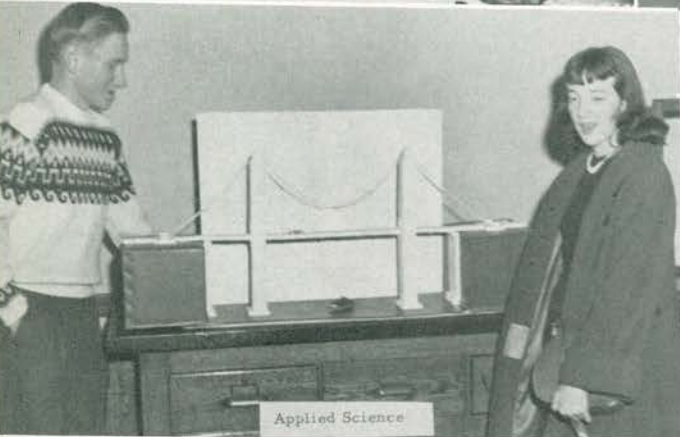

The Bangor Rams, defending State of Maine Champions, opened their 1955-56 title defense with a 65 to 52 win over Old Town in the first high school game to be played in the New Bangor Auditorium.

Rolling up a streak of five straight wins before losing to Morse 65 to 51, the Rams then went on to win nine games in a row before losing to Old Town at Old Town in a real battle.

Although they closed out the season with a 65 to 62 loss to New England finalist, Westerly, Rhode Island, in a game that didn't count for tournament points, the Rams still managed to go into the Eastern Maine Tournament as the number one team with a record of thirteen wins and three defeats.

Bangor easily beat Ellsworth 88 to 46 for the third time in the season in the opening round and pulled out a 56 to 49 squeaker from Rockland in the semi-final game. The Rams then went on to beat Stearns 71 to 57 to become the Eastern Maine Champions for the second year in a row.

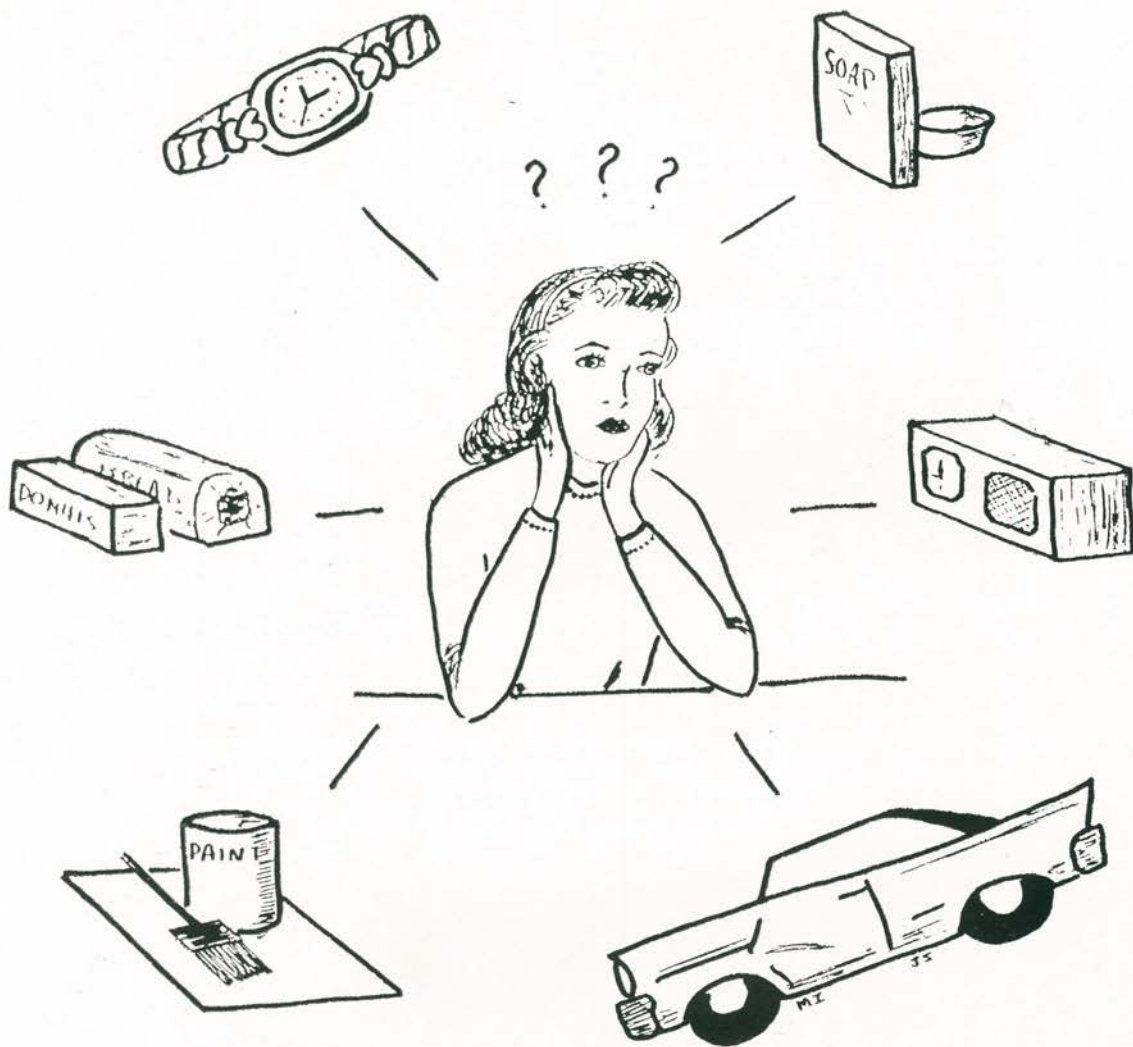
Jayvee Cheerleaders

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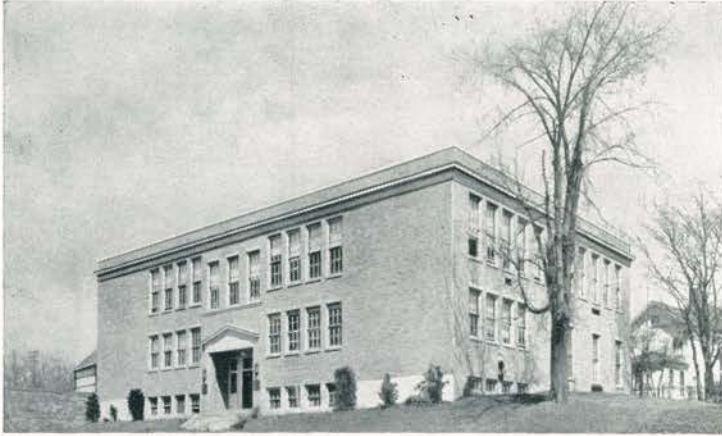
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
